JAPANESE LANGUAGE

Teaching advisors from the Japan Foundation London Language Centre are offering a taster day of Japanese to primary language co-ordinators and secondary MFL teachers. An ideal opportunity to learn some simple, basic Japanese and discuss resources, staffing, accreditation and other issues relating to the teaching of Japanese at both primary and secondary level.

GEOGRAPHY sessions will look at structuring and resourcing work on Japan within the study of People and Place as well as providing an update on the state of the Japanese economy and how this is affecting peoples' lives. Other topics include natural hazards, growth of settlements (in particular, Tokyo) and resourcing Japan on the internet.

PRIMARY TEACHERS will have a very hands-on day, getting to grips with haiku and experimenting with techniques to facilitate pupils' creative writing, as well as trying a range of practical art activities. The day will start with examination of a successful model for a Japan project, and how to resource and assess it.
